Community

William G. Enloe High School is a 4-A Gifted & Talented International Baccalaureate Magnet High School, located in a residential community of Wake County inside the I-440 beltline of the capital city of North Carolina. It is in close proximity to the state government complex, universities, banking and commercial facilities. In addition, it is 15 minutes from the Research Triangle Park. Enloe is made up of grades 9-12 with a current enrollment of approximately 2,600 students. Enloe is one of four Wake County magnet high schools and draws students from all over the county.

Curriculum

Enloe High School is designed to offer an attractive and unique program for high school students. The program at Enloe is divided into three main curricular areas: Humanities, Science and Mathematics, and the Visual and Performing Arts. In addition, Enloe High School offers the International Baccalaureate

Programme (IB).

The curriculum at Enloe High is unique in many ways. Students may choose to concentrate in at least one area of study where classes meet for two-period blocks of time. Areas of concentration include mathematics, science, the humanities, dance, art, broadcasting and vocational education. Coupled with this opportunity for program concentration is an array of over 200 course offerings, many of which are not offered in any other high school in Wake County. These offerings include, but are not limited to, eight foreign languages, advanced computer science, audio and television production, and extensive work in performing and visual arts. A large number of Honors, Honors Concentrated, Advanced Placement and IB courses are also offered.

International Baccalaureate Programme



The International Baccalaureate Programme is a prestigious course of study of closely regulated areas leading to an

IB Diploma. The diploma program integrates a student's study during eleventh and twelfth grades in a balanced humanities and science-mathematics program in six subject areas. Students successfully show their progress and mastery in assessments that are integral parts of the programme as well as by sitting for examinations in each of the six areas against an international criterion-referenced standard. Ninety-one nations have schools offering diploma programs. Enloe applied for the IB programme and undertook a rigorous self-evaluation, as well as training at IB sites for teachers, and visits from an IB committee to qualify to offer this very impressive programme.

RANKING OF STUDENTS

Class rank is based on final grades in all subjects and is computed at the end of each school year. Grade point average is derived by dividing the total number of quality points by the number of credits attempted. Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) courses get two extra points, Honors (H) courses get one extra point.

Enloe's schedule is a modified traditional eight period day, with each class period lasting approximately 42 minutes for the entire school year. Some courses are offered on semester format and others, year long. There are opportunities for students to take a 0 or 9th period course for a maximum credit earning potential of eight credits per year.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Civilizations and Culture 9 (C&C) - The ninth grade course in Civilizations and Culture meets the requirements for ninth grade required English course and ninth grade social studies, Civics & Economics. These are honors level courses.

Civilizations and Culture 10 (C&C) - The tenth grade course in Civilizations and Culture meets the requirements for tenth grade level required English course and tenth grade social studies, World History. These are honors level courses and an option with AP World History is available.
