Food Lion

Together in Education: Enloe PTSA – School code 1796

Harris Teeter's "Together in Education" program donates a percentage of the purchase dollars of eligible items back to schools. Shoppers must register their Harris Teeter VIC card. Register your card at www.HarrisTeeter.com. Click on "Together in Education" in the "Community" section. Then link your VIC card to Enloe PTSA, school code 1796. Harris Teeter will allow you to link up to five organizations to your single VIC card. Your earned contributions to the program will be split between your selections. You may also link your VIC card at a store's cash register or customer service desk. Each VIC card holder has to re-register at the beginning of the school year.

Fees and Fines:

On Oct. 7, individually printed fees/fines sheets were distributed to any students who owe money for reasons such as a lost book, a lost locker lock, or property damage assessments (for example a damaged musical instrument). To pay off these debts, students must bring cash (exact change) or a cashier’s check or money order (made payable to Enloe High School) to Ms. Crocker in Student Services. Enloe does not accept personal checks. Receipts are provided upon payment.

Please note that all fee and fine information is available on SPAN, so students and parents who have access can view the status at any time. Unpaid debts from a previous school do carry over. All debts must be resolved before graduation. Media Center overdue fines are paid in the Media Center. If lost book fines are paid and then the lost book is found, the student can turn in the book and be reimbursed.

Given the cost and effort to print individual forms combined with the ease of the information’s availability through SPAN, the forms will not be distributed regularly.

Please work with your student to be sure they are debt-free at school!

2008-2009 Budget Approval

The 2008-2009 budget was approved by the membership at the Aug. 26 PTSA meeting. Cathy Couch, PTSA treasurer, presented the officers' recommendations which were based on the previous year's performance, economic indicators and shifts in requirements for program expenditures.

The total budget for the year is \$30,983.17. Primary sources of funds are membership, passive fundraisers e.g. Harris Teeter, Target cards, and \$6,233.17 carried over from last year. Teen Safety Behind the Wheel - A message from Jordan Driving School

Safety on our highways is a concern for us all. It will take us all to provide it. How better to begin than with parents collaborating with their teen to learn the skills of driving, a respect for the highway transportation system, and the importance of making the right decisions? Taking an active role in your teen's driver training will help reduce the risk of an accident. The following are a few tips to help the parent:

1. Be a good behind-the-wheel role model for your teen.
2. Know your teen's maturity level and use that knowledge when making decisions regarding what they can and cannot do in the car.
3. Limit night driving and peer passengers.
4. Set consequences for violations of the law or set family driving rules. As a parent, you can always have control and set limits that are tougher than the state laws. You control the keys.

Practice as much as possible with your teen during the 12-month learner's permit phase. Take opportunities to ride with your teen after they get their license to monitor their improvement. Let them know that continued improvement is required. Teens, here are a few tips to remember as you continue to drive more often. We hope you will remember some of these from your driver education class.

1. Use good seeing habits. Keep your eyes moving. Continually identify to the front, rear and sides. Decide what you need to see – other vehicles, pedestrians, animals, road signs, pavement markings, traffic lights, etc. Identify early those things that you need to analyze and adjust for. You do not want to make sudden movements with your vehicle.
2. You will be doing some expressway driving and driving on multiple lane roads. Avoid changing lanes too often. Unnecessary weaving from one lane to another can lead to a collision.
3. Leave early. Giving yourself plenty of time to get where you are going lessens the possibility of you making mistakes because you are late and trying to make up time. If you find that you are late, do not take unnecessary risks like speeding, not stopping at stop signs or speeding up on yellow. You might be a few minutes late; you will be very late if you have an accident or get pulled over for a traffic violation.
4. You probably remember learning three-point turns in driver education. Remember, the safest method for turning the vehicle around is to go around the block.
5. Always wear your seatbelt and insist that your passengers do as well.
6. Never drive when impaired by alcohol or any drug, legal or illegal. Never ride with a driver who has been drinking or is otherwise impaired. Develop a plan with your parents about how you will deal with this type of situation and follow the plan. Nearly half of those killed in alcohol related collisions had not been drinking but were victims of drunk drivers.
7. Distractions bring about a higher crash risk for all drivers. For novice teen drivers distractions create an even more dangerous situation because of their inexperience. Dangerous distractions: Teen passengers, cell phones, drinking or eating, etc. anything that takes your attention away from driving.

Jordan Driving School is contracted to provide the driver education program at no cost to the student. This program, required in North Carolina for all students under 18 years of age before they can receive their learner's permit, is in conjunction with Wake County Public Schools. It is available to all eligible students, public, private or home schooled. In October, Jordan Driving School is releasing their Parent & Teen Behind-the-Wheel driving manual that we will give to all driver education students. Those parents who come to the last day of classroom will also receive an instructional video. Jordan's driving teachers will invite parents to meet with them and their child at the end of the six hours of driving. During this time, the Driver Education teacher will go over with the parent the student's driving skill strengths and weaknesses. At this time, they will issue the driver education certificate and give each parent a parent-teen manual that includes a parent-teen driving contract and a parent-teen driving log. The parent will use this manual to continue practice driving time with their child. The goal is to give parents more insight into training their teens to become safe and responsible drivers.
