Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:04 pm by President Lorraine Johnson

I President's Report: Johnson introduced the 2009-10 board members. E-news sign up; communication vehicle for the year; PTSA, Enloe School or WCPSS related to be posted on e-news. Safety committee met just prior to this meeting and will meet before the PTSA meetings for the rest of the year. Safety committee goal is to partner with immediate community and attend East Raleigh CEC meetings. Amy Madison will lead safety committee this year. Open House September 10th; sign up to help at the PTSA table or help supervise in the cafeteria during the "3 lunch periods". Eagle Vision should have arrived just before school started which will be the only hardcopy for this year. Eagle Vision will be posted on the Enloe website for the rest of the year in an effort to go green. If you do not have internet access and need a hard copy fill out the form to get a paper copy in the mail. Thanks to Mary Ellen Coffee who headed up the Senior Awards Banquet and posts the e-news on a weekly basis; Whitney McMahan for the Graduation Reception along with an excellent group of volunteers; Michelle Burrrows Flight School organizer; Casi Fuller coordinated teacher breakfast and Carry Vail Eagle Vision Layout this summer. Also thanks to Whitney McMahan, Deb Brown and Mary Ellen Sura who audited the PTSA Financials. Class of 2010 graduation ceremony is Friday June 11th at 8 am.

II Principal's Report: Dr. Cochran: Thanked those who participated in Flight School. The safety video that was shown during Flight School will be shared with whole student body. An effort to reach out to and encourage freshmen to attend was successful. The first ever Senior Breakfast was attended by more than 300 kids which was very positive. Student count as of today is 2640. Scheduling is an art and the people who did ours did a very good job to meet the balance without eliminating courses. Enloe did not wipe out electives like other schools have due to budget cuts. ID badges; when everyone has them strict enforcement will begin. Courtyard is not yet ready, but should be soon. Students will eat in the cafeteria or West Gym lobby until the courtyard is ready. Keeping students contained within the building and courtyard is a safety measure to help keep better tabs on them. PLT Wednesdays; activities keeping them in the East Building until their activity starts. Eagle Buddy program up and running; big focus on 9th grade. 300 students volunteered to buddy with 300 freshmen. Another parking lottery next Thursday; Friday drawing. Lockers; all 9th were assigned. 10-12 got to pick where they wanted their locker. Positively received. 10-12 has to take the initiative to get their locker.

III Action Items

Minutes: Motion to approve May 12 minutes as written by Adreinne Lumpkin, second Barbara Marley. All yeah.

Treasurer: Cathy Couch: Large carryover from last year. Raised teacher grants and some start up funds for new programs. Line items the same as in the past with minor fluctuations.

Motion to approve 2009-10 budget as proposed by Ruben Young, second Keila Keadle. All Yeah.

Audit: Whitney McMahan: McMahan, Mary Ellen Sura and Deb Brown audited the 2008-09 financial statements. No discrepancies were found. The NCPTA has some Management items that were not met. However, the PTSA Board was not previously aware of these items and can include them for next year.

Intervention/Prevention: Mary Hammrick: Staff person Kevin Neely intervention coordinator focusing on 9th grade right at the beginning of the school year. Rebecca Clark is the faculty coordinator of Eagle Buddy program. 35-40 faculty members are buddies; some carried over from last year and some have 2 buddies. Kicked off Big Bro/Sis program; matching until the day school started. Level I and II EOG 9th graders first then kids from our base population. Student who we “think” will need more help from the start.

Membership: Keila Keadle: To-date, we have collected \$ 3,828 in dues from 161 members. At this time last year, we had collected \$ 5,466 from 270 members. Following is a breakdown by category:
